## 9:50 - 10:50 a.m. Water x Weeds: **Building an Integrated Weed**

Management Approach Becky Bowling, Ph.D., Assistant Professor and Extension Specialist, turfgrass Science and Management, University of Tennessee Institute of Agriculture (UTIA) This presentation considers the impact of irrigation practices, rainfall, and soil characteristics on weed ecology and herbicide movement in turfgrass systems. Review how too much or too little water can lead to the spread of

select hard-to-control weeds and how modifying cultural practices can significantly reduce weed pressure. There will be additional discussion on how soil moisture and post-application watering practices can influence off-target movement of herbicides through soil movement, runoff and volatilization/drift.

## Our Speakers:

**Becky Bowling, Ph.D.,** is an assistant professor and extension specialist with the University of Tennessee Institute of Agriculture (UTIA) specializing in turfgrass science and management. She completed her B.S. and M.S. in horticulture at Texas Tech University in 2010 and 2013 respectively, before completing her Ph.D. in crop and soil sciences at the University of Georgia in 2017. In her role, Bowling works in partnership with faculty/scientists, professional organizations, county extension agents, and others to conduct applied research and provide resources and programmatic support to the Tennessee turfgrass industry and beyond. Her program focuses on environmental turfgrass science with an emphasis on optimizing resource use efficiency to promote environmentally and economically — sustainable management practices for the turfgrass industry, particularly as it relates to

water resource management.

Claire Phillips, Ph.D., is a research soil scientist with the USDA-ARS Northwest Sustainable Agroecosystems Research Unit in Pullman, Washington, where she studies greenhouse gas emissions and soil carbon sequestration in dryland cropping systems. Prior to her current position, she was a research associate with USDA-ARS in Corvallis, Oregon, where she worked with grass seed producers and collaborated with the Oregon State University Turfgrass Program led by Dr. Alec Kowalewski. Together with the OSU Turf Team, she researched soil carbon changes and greenhouse gas emissions from cool-season PNW turf systems. Phillips received B.S. and M.S. degrees in biology from Stanford University and a Ph.D. from Oregon State University in 2009. She held post-doc positions in Corvallis, Oregon, Nova Scotia, Canada, and Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory. Phillips was an instructor in the Crops and Soil Sciences Department at Oregon State from 2013-15 prior to joining USDA-ARS.

Mike Richardson, Ph.D., has been a faculty member in the Department of Horticulture at the University of Arkansas since 1998, where he teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in turfgrass management and conducts research on cultural practices that impact cool- and warm-season turfgrass production in transition zone environments. Richardson has been recognized as a Fellow in both the Crop Science Society of America and the American Society of Agronomy and was awarded the Fred V. Grau Turfgrass Science Award. He was also recognized at the University of Arkansas with the Spitze Land Grant University Faculty Award of Excellence.
