***Our Speakers***

**Alec Kowalewski, Ph.D.**, received his Masters and Ph.D. from Michigan State University. Prior to joining Oregon State University, he taught at Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College and worked as a research scientist at the University of Georgia Turf Breeding Program in Tifton, Georgia. Kowalewski has also served as a Briggs & Stratton Yardsmart Expert and Operational Consultant at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing,

China. In 2012, he joined Oregon State University as the Turfgrass Specialist, holding a teaching and extension-based appointment. His current research and extension interests include improving the environmental and economic sustainability of turfgrass management.

**Ross Niewola, CGCS** has over 15 years of working in golf course maintenance and most recently, Niewola was the golf course superintendent at Walla Walla Country Club in Washington before joining the USGA in 2024. A Penn State grad originally from the East Coast, Niewola has lived and worked in Virginia, Colorado, Arizona, New Jersey, Washington, and Northern and Southern California. He has experience with both warm- and cool-season grasses and he has worked at both public and private facilities. Throughout his career, Niewola has had the privilege of working on and hosting 13 tournaments for the PGA Tour, the LPGA, and the USGA, and has achieved the Certified Golf Course Superintendent (CGCS) designation.

**Karlee Pruitt Larkin** obtained her master's degree from the University of Arkansas in horticulture in 2020. There she studied the efficacy of biological pesticides on two-spotted spider mites, powdery mildew, and gray mold in strawberry production in high tunnels. After completing her graduate studies, Pruitt transitioned into education, serving as a program manager for the developing turf management program at North Arkansas College. Her next endeavor was spent as a horticulture instructor at the College of Western Idaho. Finally, she landed in Walla Walla, Wash., where she is the current Ag Science / Turf Management Instructor at Walla Walla Community College. Pruitt Larkin teaches several topics, including turf management, insects and diseases, pesticide safety, plant science, soil science, irrigation and sustainability. Pruitt Larkin's goals for the program are to increase online content and to increase enrollment in the program.
